

## Open departure dates – summer is better

### This is part 1 of the Get out, Get Active tours

**PLEASE NOTE:** Most of the outdoor activities are weather dependent! Too much, or even too little wind, will determine what you can on certain days. But ... we will do our best to manage around this wherever we can.

#### In short:

With an average of 11 sunshine hours per day in summer (December to March), Cape Town is surely the place to be for an activity tour to Southern Africa! Even in mid-winter 6 hours is not bad! With all the great weather to boot, and all the activity options, this is the tour to undertake! Especially if you want to – GET OUT, GET ACTIVE!

#### Day 0: Friday, 2026 (Meals on board)

Overnight flight/s from Europe to Cape Town. Various airlines offer direct flights from European hubs to Cape Town.

#### Day 1: Saturday, 2026 (Meals on board / D)

On arrival in the “Mother City”, as Cape Town is lovingly called, and when you have gone through customs, a representative of Cape AgriTours, and your English-speaking guide for the tour will meet you and assist you to your touring vehicle. Weather permitting, you will then make your way directly to Table Mountain, the majestic sandstone bastion guarding over the “Mother City” of SA – Cape Town. Ascend the mountain by cable car and spend some free time on the big flat top. Today the mountain is one of the new 7 Wonders of Nature, a World Heritage site and a National Monument. As you will be on the mountain at around lunchtime, it could be a good idea to enjoy something to eat or even enjoy your first beer here.

#### OPTIONS:

- Abseiling at the top

From the mountain, an orientation tour of the city is undertaken as you make your way to your city hotel.

### Day 2: Sunday, 2026 (B / L / -)

No trip to South Africa can ever be complete with undertaking the Grand Tour of the Cape Peninsula.

Departing from your hotel, travel via Maidens Cove (photo stop) to Hout Bay harbour, from where a short boat cruise will take you out to Duiker Island to view the colony of Cape fur seals and some other aquatic life. On your return to the mainland, there will be some free time to bargain with the curio traders on the quayside, before the journey continues southward on the Peninsula.

From Hout Bay you will travel along Chapman's Peak Drive (photo stop) to the Cape of Good Hope Nature Reserve, where you will view both the Cape of Good Hope and Cape Point. You will then make your way to Simon's Town, where a **seafood lunch** will be enjoyed at the Seaforth Restaurant. After lunch, there will be time to visit the African penguin breeding colony on Boulders Beach, before finally today, you will be transferred back to your hotel.

#### OPTIONS:

- Kayaking with penguins
- Snorkeling with seals

After the late lunch, dinner will be optional tonight.

- With your driver/guide
- In a sidecar by motorbike
- Sections with a bicycle

### Day 3: Monday, 2026 (B / - / -)

Today will be spent in the city area – with your driver/guide available to take you places and show you around. For today, you can choose from:

- Tandem paragliding from Signal Hill
- Scuba diving or snorkeling
- Sandboarding
- Quad biking
- Water biking / combine with kayaking with penguins
- Surfing or Wind surfing or Parasailing
- Helicopter flights

Meals for today are not included, as the programme for the day is not firm.

### Day 4: Tuesday, 2026 (B / L / -)

Today after breakfast and check out, it is pack up and go, as you make your way out to Hermanus. A scenic drive along Clarence Drive and the False Bay coastline, will get you to Betty's Bay, Kleinmond and Hermanus – according to the WWF, the best land-based place in the world, from which to view whales (whale season is from July to end of November). There are 3 ways to watch these gentle giants – either from *terra firme*, or going out on a kayak, or if you want to get real close, a sea safari! A **seafood lunch** is just the thing when you are here. There will be some leisure time in the late afternoon.

#### OPTIONS (on route):

- White Water Rafting & Tubing (Palmiet) – depending on the season, it can be easy, or a lovely challenge
- Wine tasting
- Stony Point penguin colony
- Hiking

### **Day 5: Wednesday, 2026 (B / L / -)**

Today we play rough! Travel from Hermanus to Gansbaai/Kleinbaai, to join one of the White Shark cage diving operations, and after a relaxing **lunch**, join a crocodile tour, and dive with these pre-historic beasts! If the crocs are not your thing, then join a beach ride on horseback.

#### OPTIONS:

- White Shark cage diving
- Crocodile diving
- Horseback beach ride – from a gentle walk to a gallop

### **Day 6: Thursday, 2026 (B / - / -)**

Today, after a leisurely breakfast and check out, you move on again! The first part of the journey will take you through the Hemel-en-Aarde Valley, where the first stop of the day is made at a selected wine cellar, for a tasting of some classic wines. Then you make your way to Caledon and Middelton, where you will find K3 – the longest zipline in the world!! The alternative to this adrenaline rush activity, is a canopy tour near Elgin, as you travel towards Stellenbosch – a lovely student town, where you will stay overnight, for the last two nights of the tour. Lunch and dinner will be optional today.

- Canopy tour

### **Day 7: Friday, 2026 (B / L / D)**

The final day of the tour will be spent in two of the oldest towns in South Africa – both in the Heart of the Cape Winelands. Stellenbosch dates back to 1679, and Franschhoek (the so-called French corner) to 1688. Part of the day can be enjoyed by bicycle, or you can again jump on the back of a horse! The day will include at least 3 wine tasting stops, as well as a typical South African braai (BBQ) for lunch. The meal is even complemented with a wine tasting!

#### OPTIONS:

- Exchange the set programme above with a full day in Franschhoek on the Wine Tram

A **farewell dinner** will be enjoyed at a selected venue.

**PLEASE NOTE:** Should you decide to extend your trip to include parts of the Garden Route, the order of the last days of this programme will change – in that you will first stay in Stellenbosch and then Hermanus.

### **Day 8: Saturday, 2026 (B / meals on board)**

On the final day of the tour, there will be free time to do some last-minute shopping, before your touring vehicle takes you back to the Cape Town International Airport, where you will join your return flight to Europe. Times to be confirmed.
